Parenting; the most important job in the world.


CMC July Board Report

Budget (\$) - Mrs Paula Bell - Business Manager, presented the College budget to our Board members this week. While the College runs at an overall loss in our initial years, this deficit rapidly diminishes as we grow.

Despite this fiscal stringency, we have acquired significant improvements to resources in learning programs.

CMC Annual School Report - Board members perused this comprehensive document on the full range of services, curriculum and extra curricular activity that is on offer. Strategic plans for 2023 are included in this informative brochure.

Semester 1 Summative Reporting Analysis.- Board members previewed the results summary for Year 7 and Year 8. Results for Year 7 are outstanding in achievement, effort



and behaviour. Year 8 results in effort and behaviour are good with a couple of subject areas reflecting a step up in level of difficulty. Version 9 of the National Curriculum is challenging.

Uniform Issues - Board members discussed recent concerns with items of the girl's uniform. Discussion affirmed that the new dress with a substantial hem has addressed that issue. There is still a concern with the fit and hem of the skirt. Mrs Jeanette Refalo and two Board members will consult with the uniform shop to put a solution in place for next year.

Results are due to be released in the coming weeks. The 2023 reports are quite different to those to which you will have become accustomed to in year 3 and 5 testing. Instead of students being placed on a 10-band scale, there will be four proficiencies.

- Exceeding: the student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: the student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- Developing: the student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.

 Needs additional support: the student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes that are expected at the time of testing.

Importantly, the results in 2023 will not be comparable to results from 2008 to 2022. Basically, there is a new "line in the sand", and ACARA are "starting again".

Student reports will be made available on Parent Lounge as soon as the College is able to upload them. You will receive a confirmation email once they are available, and we encourage you to discuss the report with your child. Please keep in mind that it is a point in time test, and while important, doesn't define them or their abilities in any way and the most important aspect of their schooling remains their consistent effort and application towards their studies each week.

Student-Led Conferencing will again run this term, on Thursday 27 of July. Bookings via Parent Lounge for all core subjects (Religion, English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Health & Physical Education) from Wednesday 19 July and close on Tuesday 25 July.
