Making an Impression in 2024

Catherine McAuley College grows by another year level and welcomes 155 new Year 7's. Across all areas of Teaching, Administration and Support there are twenty-one new staff.

We welcome Stage 2 buildings and thank Fergus Builders and Bold Architects for delivering quality facilities on time.

Our parent evening for new parents scheduled for last Thursday evening ran into a Cyclone warning so it is now on Tuesday 13 February at 5:00pm (following the Stymie Parent Information Session) under the Kappa wing. Especially new parents but any parent is most welcome to come along for a meet and greet to start the year. Our Parent Engagement Group leaders will host the event with a tour of the new facilities available to the curious.

In the broader context of Catholic Education Queensland, our State based QCEC (Queensland Catholic Education Commission) advertised the following statistics to start the year. There are 160,000 students enrolled in catholic schools including 11,800 Preps. There are 11,400 teachers and 17,900 in a plethora of support roles. Confidence in Catholic education is very high with the onus on our staff to affirm that support. Although every parent is busy the opportunity is there to have input and help us build into a quality life changing experience for students, staff and parents alike.

Best Use Of The Carpark Pick-up Zone

Two of my favourite Benjamin Franklin Quotes. "Practice makes perfect" and "By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail." We may not always be able to perfect everything we do, but "Practice does make progress". For this reason, homework is a critical part of schooling at Catherine McAuley College. Students of all year levels should anticipate between 30 and 45 minutes of homework for each subject, each week. Each subject has their own variation to homework delivery and expectations, but all homework will be important practice of concepts learnt in class.

The homework expectations can be quite different to that in some primary schools and teachers will support all students in meeting homework requirements for their class. Parents can do their part to support, by doing two key things. Develop and support a household routine that includes time



for homework and ensure a location within the house that is supervised, free of distractions (technology including phones) and conducive to students producing their best work. It is important that parents are part of the learning process, and this can include assisting their child with work at home, however it is vitally important that students produce their own work and so parents are always asked to take a supportive and guiding approach.

Elective Rotations

Students in both year seven and eight progress through a rotational course, exposing them to a range of subjects across the year. Not all students will study the same elective at the same time, however by the end of that year, all students will have experienced all elective subjects. This program is designed to give students experience in a range of subjects, reflecting the options that will become available for their selection in the middle years (year 9 and 10). Current rotations are:

Year 7 - Visual Art, Performing Arts, Digital Technologies, Design Technologies

Year 8 - Food Technologies, Drama & Spanish, Performing Arts, Robotics. Year 9 - Students have started on some of their electives, chosen at the end of last year. Families in this cohort are reminded that by the end of the year, all students will have completed their three subjects of choice, along with a semester of Humanities (History & Geography).

Responsible Thinking Process

At CMC we utilise the Responsible Thinking Process to support student behaviour. The process is supported by research and is extremely effective if students, parents, and staff all work together. Please familiarise yourself with the process and ask your child if you require further clarification.





- Rather than being a set of rules, RTP is an attitude about how
- people act with others. It teaches students how to reach their goals without violating the rights of others.
- Through the questioning technique students are challenged to search within themselves and decide the way they want to be



- . We, as individuals are responsible for what we do.
- Students have the right to learn, and teachers have the right to teach, in safety No one has the right to disrupt, to prevent other students from learning, or to violate the rights of others.
- The RTC process is designed to intervene before a student's behaviour impacts others in order to help students stay engaged in the learning environment and to remain safe and



- Students who disrupt and don't want to learn are given a set of questions and if
 they continue to <u>disrupt</u> they go to the RTC. In the RTC, students think about what
 they have done and then try to think of other ways they can behave so they don't
- get referred again.
 This allows the student to consider options for what they could do differently in class next time (higher order of thinking/PCT).

VISION

To equip students with the tools and strategies needed to think and act responsibly, problem solve and recognise that their actions have individual and collective consequences.

PURPOSE

The purpose of Catherine McAuley College's Responsible Thinking Classroom is to create an environment that is safe, respectful, conducive to learning and free from disruptive

behaviour, where students develop the ability to become self-disciplined.

School Student Broadband Initiative

What is the School Student Broadband Initiative?

To boost education opportunities and narrow the digital divide, the Australian Government is providing up to 30,000 eligible families with school age children with no internet at home access to free nbn® until 31 December 2025 under the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI)



Access to the SSBI will become easier, with the announcement of a National Referral Centre that parents/carers with school students can contact directly to check their eligibility.

To be eligible for SSBI, families working directly with an SSBI Nominating Organisation, or self-nominating through the National Referral Centre, must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including from Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindy in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in WA).
- Not have an active nbn® network internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a premises that can access a standard2 nbn service.
- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days.
- Either be referred by a nominating organisation or have your suitability determined via an assessment conducted by the National Referral Centre.



Eligible candidates are from (min*) 13 years of age & (max) not yet 17 years of age, and (min) Gr 8 level in 2024.


* age 13 prior to 30 JUN 24 with Army approval.
